# **GBI Europe – From Bratislava to Munich**

## **Tour description**

Day 1: Bratislava (SK) – Stockerau (AT)

After cycling through Bratislava we meet the Danube river and follow it for almost the entire day on the great Danube cycle path. After 70 km we reach the Austrian capital of Vienna and do some sightseeing detour here before we head to our destination.

Day 2: Stockerau (AT) – Herzogenburg (AT)

We explore the Weinviertel before we again reach the Danube river for a while. Later we turn into the Traisen Valley, where our todays camp is located.

Day 3: Herzogenburg (AT) – Steyr (AT)

Today we experience for the first time some hills on the route and a quite long stage. And we again follow the lovely Danube river before we turn into the hilly backcountry at Ybbs. We sleep this night in the city of Steyr.



Day 4: Steyr (AT) – St. Georgen im Attergau (AT)
The last complete day in Austria is the most hilly one and we are facing lots of ups and downs. Our rewards are nice mountain panoramas, lovely villages and at the end of the stage we meet the Attersee, were we could refresh ourself with a plunge into the water.

Day 5: St. Georgen im Attergau (AT) – Inzell (D)
Today we cross the Austrian Salzkammergut with many large lakes. The city of Salzburg is welcoming us halfway of todays stage. This is the perfect place for a longer lunch & photo stop. Behind the city we cross the German border and cycle now in Bavaria. We meet Bad Reichenhall before we reach our destination in Inzell.

Day 6: Inzell (D) - Bad Aibling (D)

Along the northern flank of the Bavarian Alps we cycle on a hilly terrain to the west. The Chiemsee, also known as Bavarian Ocean, lies not far from our route and after a while we reach the GBI camp in Bad Aibling.

Day 7: Bad Aibling (D) – Unterföhring/Munich (D) The last tour day is short and quite flat. Soon after the start we reach the metropolitan area of Munich from the southeast. Traditionally all participants meet not too far from the tourfinish and the famous group cycling, accompanied with music and marshalled by police, takes place.

### Route characteristics & topography

We mainly cycle on cycle paths and minor streets. If unavoidable, we may also cycle partially on sections of the route along main roads with heavy traffic

The route is hilly, but also with flat areas along the rivers. There are no real mountains to be conquered this time. Track 2 has longer distances and more challenging climbs.

### We cycle for charity

Every participant commits to raise a donation for a charity project in his home country. The minimum donation depends on your country and varies between 150 − 250 €. For more details please contact your local country champion (<a href="www.gbi-event.org">www.gbi-event.org</a> -> About us).

### **Travel information**

Plane: International airport Bratislava (close to the tour start) or Vienna (well connected by train to Bratislava). International airport Munich for flying back home.

*Train & bus:* good connections to Vienna/Bratislava and from Munich to Germany and other European countries.

*GBI bus:* optional bus service from Düsseldorf via Frankfurt airport and Munich airport to Bratislava the day prior to tour start, return bus from the tour finish to Düsseldorf as well as to Munich airport directly after the tour closure
